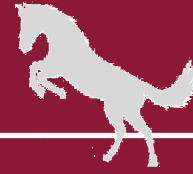

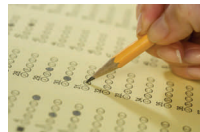

**Any seniors interested in a free college education?** Thought that might get your attention. Valparaiso University in Valparaiso, IN is offering to 2 high school seniors an opportunity to be a part of the Lutheran Leader Scholarship and Intern Program. This opportunity comes with a 4 year full-tuition scholarship. Some of the criteria are 1) demonstrates leadership ability on a district/synodical, regional or national basis 2) exhibits academic excellence in high school and 3) intends to be active in the Lutheran church as a lay leader or full time church worker. For more information see Mr. Eggold about the nomination process.

**Seniors that are interested in attending Texas A&M University at College Station or Galveston** have a scholarship opportunity. This scholarship will be awarded to at least 4 students that graduate from a high school in Bexar County or the student lives in Bexar County. It is worth \$1000 a year for 4 years. The beauty of this scholarship, sponsored by the San Antonio A&M Club Foundation, is that it will be above and beyond the financial aid package the University provides. The \$1000 scholarship recipient would also be put in a "pool" of others that the Foundation recommends to the University for more scholarship money. 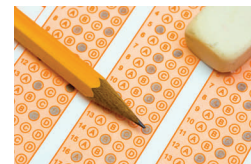

## 2 New Service Clubs at LHS!

**Servants for Christ** is a student run, student driven organization open to all LHS students any point throughout the school year. The organization's mission is to seek out the needs of the world, help fill the needs of others and serve the Savior by meeting the needs of His people. This is done through *Group Serves* and *School Serves*.

*Groups Serves* are ideas from individual students that are open to the student body to participate in and attend. They are designed and executed by students who see a need in the com-

munity or world and want to help. Examples would be mission trips, weekend service or other small service projects. *School Serves* are also student run, but are intended for school wide participation. These would include our fall and spring service days, the raising of funds for a cause and/or the collection of items to be donated for certain groups in need.

It is the goal of *Servants for Christ* to have monthly *School Serves* and various other *Group Serves* throughout the year. This month's *School Serve* will be for the individuals af-

ected by the fires. Our second new service club, **SONflowers**, sponsored by Mrs. Feola and Ms. Roese, is open to students interested in beautifying our campus. We are so proud of our students—32 signed up for the service club when the announcement went out a few weeks ago. That translates to 1/3 of LHS's student body! Their first major project will be to design and plant a biblical garden around the flagpole. The group got off to a great start on Friday, Sept. 16<sup>th</sup> as a small group of *SONflowers* spent the morning

weeding and spreading mulch around the flagpole and modulars. The group will be seeking donations of compost, potting soil, and mulch in the future, but will be glad to accept gift cards for Lowe's, Home Depot and HEB at any time. The name of the club isn't a typo—we plan to glorify God and His Son in all we do to beautify the campus our Lord has provided for us: "For as the soil makes the sprout come up and a garden causes seeds to grow, so the Sovereign Lord will make righteousness and praise spring up before all nations." 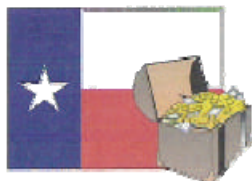
